## National recognition for significant gifts

A special national recognition program known as the 1910 Society was created in 1995 to encourage significant gifts to the council endowment fund. This support is vital to undergirding the financial stability of the Mid-America Council, and will ensure the Scouting legacy for future generations of young Americans.

To qualify as a member of the 1910 Society, an individual donor, company, or organization must contribute \$25,000 or more to the local council endowment fund. Recognition will be given for gifts of cash, stock, bonds, lead trusts, or other assets that are readily converted to cash.

The 1910 Society was named in recognition of the year in which the visionary early leaders founded the Boy Scouts of America. Those who make a gift to further endow Scouting are them-

selves modern-day visionaries.

There are four levels of recognition in the 1910 Society: \$25,000 Ernest Thompson Seton Member, \$100,000 Daniel Carter Beard Member, \$500,000 Theodore Roosevelt Member and \$1,000,000 Waite Phillips Member.

Members will receive a leather-bound edition of the Boy Scout Handbook with their name embossed in gold on the cover, an attractive personalized parchment certificate and a distinctive lapel pin/charm. The membership level is distinguished by a device on the pin.

At the Lewis and Clark District Dinner, father and son Randy and John Yates were honored as the newest members of the James E. West Fellowship. When asked why they wanted to give a gift to the council's endowment fund, this is what Randy wrote:

*"Our motivation has always been simple. Although I was in Troop 395 in Omaha as a youth, I really didn't get involved until John got into Scouts as a ten-year old Webelos. We did this together. His involvement depended on me, and my involvement depended on him. He went everywhere with me, and I went everywhere with him. Now that he's an adult, he's not only my*

*son, but my peer. I've shared in every one of his recognitions, and he in mine. That's why we are doing this. When he sees his name on the plaque, and knows what Scouting has given him, he can say he gave back as well. When he looks at my name next to it, he can say he can give a little more. Scouting has built a bond between us that can't be shaken, and we want it available for others that come down the trail. In these most uncertain times, we have to look to what's certain and good and what will have the most impact. The Boy Scouts of America is one of those certain and good organizations, and has proven to be, at least to us, of great impact."*
